**THE SERIES:** This is the first of two meetings between the teams. The final match up of the season takes place at Dodge Arena on July 19.

**OLD NEW FACES:** The Dorados had several familiar players assigned to the team on April 17. Chris Canty, Travis McAlpine, Derrick Harris and Keenan Washington are slated to play in Sunday's game against the Wranglers.



#### THE SETUP

The Dorados opened the 2008 season with a 66-40 win in **Week 1** at Texas on March 30, then had **Week 2** off. The win over the Copperheads was Rio's 10<sup>th</sup> straight on the road and 14<sup>th</sup> consecutive in regular season play. Rio returned to the field in

**Week 3** and fell 64-54 at Corpus Christi, their first road loss since 2006.

**Austin** dropped down from the AFL after last season and has struggled so far in af2 competition. They've lost their first three games of the season to Corpus Christi, Lubbock and Amarillo.



In the Southwest Division, both Austin and Texas are looking for their first wins of the season.

### DORADOS 2008 TIDBITS

#### CARPENTER OFF TO SOLID START

Dorados receiver Jermaine Carpenter is among the af2 leaders in receiving TDs with seven. His 235.5 all purpose yards in third in the league. He had a 57-yard kickoff return TD in Week 3 at Corpus Christi.

#### COLE THIRD IN OFFENSIVE TDS

QB Travis Cole, a former AFL backup, has excelled in his first two games as a starter in af2 action. His 16 offensive TDs is tied fir third in the league. He has passed for eight of those TD's and rushed for two more of his own. The 14 passing TDs have been distributed between Jermaine Carpenter (7), Anthony Chambers (4) and Eddie Jackson (3).

#### MCCANN BURNS RIO FOR TWO RETURN TDS

Corpus Christi's Ivory McCann returned two kicks for 57-yard TDs in the Week 3 matchup at Corpus Christi. McCann returned a missed field goal early in the game to post the first points for either team. His 57-yard kickoff return later in the game tied things at 54. McCann has three return TDs in two seasons vs. Rio. He also had a 57-yard kickoff return vs. Rio on June 30, 2007, in a 78-17 Dorados victory in Hidalgo.

#### DORADOS USE BYE-WEEK FOR CHARITY

The Dorados used the Week-2 Bye to host a charity Golf Tournament at Los Lagos in Edinburg on Sunday, April 6. Proceeds from the tournament, which had over 50 participants, benefit the new Dorados Foundation. The foundation supports local youth football and provides underprivileged children with the opportunity to attend Dorados games at Dodge Arena.

#### SEVERAL DORADOS MAKE af2 debuts

Seven Dorados made their af2 debuts in Week 1 at Texas. Patrick Horne, Eddie Jackson, Tiger Lyon, Travis Cole, John Scott, Raushan Rowser and Garrett Mason. Of the group, all but Cole are true pro rookies; Cole has four years of AFL experience as a backup QB.

#### CARPENTER, STATON HOT VS. TEXAS

In two career games vs. the Texas Copperheads, Jermaine Carpenter has 18 catches for 237 yards and 4 TD. Quinton Staton has 12.5 tackles and 7.0 sacks for 41 yards in three games.

### 2007 TIDBITS

#### SEE THIS 57? IT USED TO BE 66

The Dorados set a new af2 record for sacks in a season during the 2007 campaign. Originally credited with 66, a statistical review by af2 stats gurus show the team actually recorded 57 sacks. That's still five better than the previous af2 record (52) set by Carolina during the 2001 season.

#### DORADOS BECOME THIRD AF2 TEAM TO POST A SHUTOUT

The Dorados became just the third team in af2 history to shut out their opponents with a 64-0 drubbing of Laredo on July 7. Quinton Staton's field goal block with under a minute left preserved the goose egg Laredo actually made it into the end zone, but had what would have been their only TD called back on a holding penalty.

#### EXPANSION TRIALS

The Dorados were 9-0 against af2 expansion teams last season. None of last year's new clubs were quite as powerful as Spokane was in 2006; they finished 14-2 on their way to the Arena Cup title. Last year's af2 expansion teams finished a combined 41-94.

#### DORADOS SET NEW AF2 RECORD FOR SACKS IN A GAME; SET FRANCHISE SEASON MARK

The Dorados sacked Texas QB Kenton Evans 13 times on June 9, 2007, to set a new af2 record for sacks in a game and set a new franchise record for sacks in one season. Keenan Washington (4) and Quinton Staton (3.5) led the team in sacks for the game. The team's previous record was 10 sacks in a game, set on April 3, 2004 at Laredo (the Dorados' first-ever game). The previous team record for sacks in a season was 36 (for 200 yards, 2004). The af2 record in a season was 52, set by Carolina during the 2001 season. The previous af2 high for sacks in a game was 11, set by Richmond in 2001.

#### TWO RETURN TD'S IN ONE GAME

On June 30, 2007, Rio and Corpus Christi combined for a pair of return TD's. Ivory McCann of Corpus Christi returned a second quarter kickoff 57 yards for a TD, setting a Dorados opponent record in the process. After Rio converted on its next drive, the defense stood up and held the Sharks off on their next possession, forcing a 45-yard field goal attempt by Chris Onorato. Coco Blalock took the rebound off the missed attempt and weaved his way 56-yards into the Dorados record book (and one yard short of tying McCann's new af2 record) to put Rio up 40-17.

#### RECORDS SMASHED

A handful of records were set on May 26, 2007, as Rio hosted Amarillo. The Dorados won their fifth-straight game, while the receiving corps and QB Josh Kellett set a new franchise record with 29 pass receptions. Kellett's seven TD tosses fell one short of the franchise record in that category. Chris Canty (1) and Andre Goines (2) combined for three interceptions, tying a team record. Dusters WR Craig Fulton's 49-yard TD reception from Steve Panella tied another af2 record.

## **DORADOS COACHES:**

### **MARTY HAMMOND**

#### **Head Coach, Director of Football Operations**



Hammond is in his third season as Head Coach of the Dorados. He coached the team to a 15-1 regular season and Southwest Division title in 2007 after a 7-9 rookie campaign. He comes to the team after serving as the Offensive Coordinator/Receivers Coach for Tennessee Valley from 2003-04 and receivers coach in 2002. He played wide receiver at the University of West Alabama from 1992-95 and was a teammate of former Dorados coach Kevin Guy. Hammond graduated in 1996 with a degree in computer science. As a freshman, he was named the Gulf Coast Conference Rookie of the Year after catching 39 passes for 339 and two touchdowns. A native of Lexington, Ala., he was an All-State pick and MVP for Lexington High School. Hammond is familiar with the Dorados, having served as a training camp coach for the Dorados during the 2005 preseason. In 1998 he served as an Assistant Coach at Spanish River High School in Boca Raton, Fla., then moved on as an Assistant Offensive Coordinator at Santaluces High School in Lantana, Fla., in 1999.

### **CORY STONE**

#### **Asst. Head Coach, Defensive Coordinator, Player Personnel**



Stone, a Memphis native, played at the University of Tennessee (UT) and lettered in 1993 and 1994 for the Volunteers as a defensive tackle. Stone played eight years in the Arena Football League, beginning in 1996 and ending in 2005 with the Philadelphia Soul. Stone was a starter for a New York Dragons that holds the record for the most points (99) ever scored in an Arena Football League Game.

Stone started his coaching career in 2006 with the Bakersfield Blitz of af2. He helped coach the Blitz to their best season ever and helped lead the team to their first playoff victory ever. Stone coached the 2006 AF2 linemen on the year Jerry Turner. The Blitz were the only team in 2006 that had three players ranked in the top 10 for sacks, and tackles for losses, while the defensive line finished second in total sacks (42). Coach Stone also

helped coach a Blitz team that finished the 2006 af2 season ranked number one in total defense.

### **FRANK FRANZ** **Assistant Coach**



Franz returns to the Dorados for his fourth season. Franz attended McMurry University in Abilene where he excelled in football as an All-Conference quarterback and graduated with a BS in Education in 1998. In the spring of 1999, he began work at Texas State University as a Strength and Conditioning Coach and earned a Masters Degree in Exercise Science from Texas State in 2000. While there, Frank was responsible for designing and implementing strength and conditioning program for a variety of men's and women's NCAA Division I sports. During his time as a strength coach he helped to produce three NFL draft picks, a 1st round NBA selection, a 1st round MLB selection, and a National Championship Cheerleading Squad. In the fall of 2002 he began work as a varsity Football and Track Coach at Sharyland High School and helped guide the football team to a District Championship.

**HOUSTON** — The Rio Grande Valley Dorados opened the 2008 season with a 66-40 victory over the Texas Copperheads Sunday at the Berry Center. The win was Rio's 10-straight on the road dating back to the 2006 season.

Cole and Carpenter also linked up for a pair of 30-yard TD's before the half.

Texas pulled within 12 of the Dorados after a 58-yard kickoff return by Armar Watson 4:44 into the third, but Cole and Carpenter came through with a 13-yard score with 7:21 remaining in the third.

Pierre Thomas picked off Texas QB Rudy Carlton with 5:24 in the final stanza to tie Rio's record for road points (66), a mark set in the 2007 opener at Corpus Christi. Thomas added 13 tackles on the defensive side of the ball.

Shaun Rochon led the Copperheads with 13 catches for 135 yards and three TD. Carlton finished 25-for-46 with five TD and 276 yards. He was picked off three times.

The Dorados have next week off and return to action on the road at Corpus Christi on April 12.

**CORPUS CHRISTI** --- The Rio Grande Valley Dorados (1-1) saw their 10-game road winning streak and 14-game regular season winning streak halted in a 61-54 loss to the Corpus Christi Sharks (2-1) at American Bank Center on Saturday night.

Corpus Christi quarterback Brian Villanueva connected with Ivory McCann for the game-winning 5-yard touchdown with 27.2 seconds remaining in the game, two minutes after McCann tied things at 54-54 on a 57-yard kickoff return TD.

McCann's fourth quarter kickoff return TD was the third overall in the game. The other two were in the first as McCann opened the scoring on a 57-yard missed field goal return with 8:45 left and Rio's Jermaine Carpenter returned a kickoff with 5:53 remaining for the Dorados' first score of the night.

The Sharks took a 41-26 lead into the half, led in part by a ground attack that totaled 67 yards on 16 carries. Sharks FB John Cook, a hulking 6-foot-3, 300-pound FB, barreled along for two rushing TDs.

Rio tied things up with a pair of TDs in the third quarter and gained their only lead of the game with 4:59 remaining in the final stanza on Eddie Jackson's 10-yard reception from Travis Cole.

McCann scored all three Corpus TDs in the fourth quarter. He also hauled in a 21-yard TD catch and finished with four TDs and 140 all purpose yards on scoring plays.

The win was the first in four tries for the Sharks against RGV and improves their record to 2-1. The Dorados drop to 1-1.

The Dorados return to action at Austin on Sunday, April 20, at 3 p.m.
